Noh play in Paris, the world of Yuka Toyoshima

Stories of Noh transformed into contemporary visual works

Yuka Toshima is an image creator living in Paris, who has revived the typical classic Noh plays such as "Matsukaze" and "Sumidagawa" in the world of images, with an independent aesthetic feeling. She started with the project "HELENA" in 2001 with this doubt in mind, and has spun a new story from there onwards. Her aim was not merely the adaptation of the original, but rather, to convert the elements of the original play to fit the present age, and to invent a new story from it through abstraction. In the project that continued till 2004, "TOKYO MON AMOUR" (2002) derived from "Matsukaze" was produced and this film shot by her in Tokyo before her second visit to France, is her maiden video venture.

















She reconstructed "Dream Noh" in the contemporary style where she carried out a fusion of stage scenes and videos. In 2005-2006 with collaboration with Compagnie des Lucioles she gave a well-known theatrical production <<Camelia>>. The Compagnie des Lucioles, is a drama group inspired by the Noh and is not only actively involved in creating such masterpieces, but also participates in French performance tours and conducts Noh dramas. After creating a trilogy of HELENA in 2006 she started a new project "Portrait". She says "through HELENA, where we call upon the characters from Noh into the present world, I want the next part of this trilogy be the exact opposite, and depict a small history of every single contemporary man."





















A story of its own

"One can catch a whole life of an individual in a flash through camera." The people she has already photographed include the artist Didier Serplet and corporate executive Jean-Pierre Kerjouan.
